## 6. **REASON FOR SIGNIFICANCE** (please tick applicable boxes)

For a tree/s to be considered for listing on the Significant Tree Register, it should satisfy at least two of the criteria, especially if the main attribute is visual/aesthetic value.

Cultural, Social and/or Commemorative Values	Highly valued by the community for reasons of strong religious, spiritual, cultural, educational, political or other social associations, including Indigenous culture and heritage.
Historic Values	<ul> <li>Associated with a well-known public figure or group.</li> <li>Reflecting a specific era of landscape design.</li> <li>Associated with a heritage-listed place.</li> <li>Forming part of a recognised historic garden or park.</li> </ul>
Botanic/ Scientific Values	<ul> <li>Of high horticultural or genetic research/educational value.</li> <li>An important source of propagation stock, including specimens that are particularly resistant to disease or climatic extremes.</li> </ul>
Ecological Values	<ul> <li>Important for threatened flora, fauna, ecosystems or natural landscapes.</li> <li>Rare, threatened or locally uncommon species or ecological communities.</li> <li>Provide a significant habitat element for rare or threatened fauna.</li> <li>Indigenous remnant trees that predate urban development. Significant remnant communities are not included in the Register – however, other smaller fragmented elements of natural heritage may be included.</li> </ul>
Visual/ Aesthetic Values	<ul> <li>Situated within a very prominent location or context.</li> <li>Outstanding for height, trunk circumference or canopy spread.</li> <li>Highly visible and could be considered a landmark.</li> <li>Exhibit an unusual growth form or physical feature, including unusually pruned forms.</li> <li>Contribute significantly to the establishment of local character.</li> </ul>
