**PURPOSE**

The purpose of this report is to amend the capital program of the section 7.12 Contributions Plan for FY2023-24, and to present the revised capital program for public exhibition for a period of 28 days.

**RECOMMENDATION**

1. That the report be received and noted.
2. The amended section 7.12 capital program be placed on public exhibition for a period of 28 days.
3. Should Council receive no submissions, that the revised s7.12 contributions plan be adopted on conclusion of the public exhibition period. If submissions are received, a further report tabling submissions will be presented to Council for review and adoption.

**BACKGROUND**

In August 2022 Council repaired a sinkhole outside 44 Gladesville Road and discovered a stormwater drainage system that runs between 50 Gladesville Road and beginning of Matthew Street. The system includes 150 diameter pipeline that runs underground with 6 450x450 stormwater pits. The current system is inadequate and under capacity.

**REPORT**

As part of Council's review of its Asset Management Plan in late 2019, Council sample tested and inspected 20% of its stormwater network using a quick view camera method and follow-up condition assessment. It should be noted that Council only undertook a sample as stated above, as it is cost prohibitive to CCTV the entire LGA stormwater network (this being an underground asset).

Council, to date, has renewed all known low condition scoring stormwater assets as part of our renewal program. The list of completed upgraded assets include:

### Woolwich Stormwater upgrade

Council in FY2021-22 resurfaced and renewed Valentia Street, Woolwich. Whilst carrying out these works, Council's contractors came across a water leak. Initial investigations of our stormwater system including CCTV was carried out, and it was established that the leak had emanated from a Sydney Water main.

Council investigation and assessment of the condition of its stormwater system found that it was in good condition overall, and only required maintenance cleaning and flushing of the

pipeline. A further follow-up CCTV investigation was also completed to make sure the system is still functioning adequately.

Council is, therefore, proposing the following amendment to S7.12 program FY2023-24, relocating project funding of its Stormwater Capital Renewal from the Woolwich location to Gladesville Road, Hunters Hill:

Due to the overall condition of the asset and ongoing flooding issues, it is recommended that the upgrade of the location of this stormwater system be prioritised, and that S7.12 funds be re-allocated to the stormwater drainage system between 50 Gladesville Road and Matthew Street.
